Pray

Read

Revelation 12:7-10 (NIV)

Then war broke out in heaven. Michael and his angels fought against the dragon, and the dragon and his angels fought back. But he was not strong enough, and they lost their place in heaven. The great dragon was hurled down—that ancient serpent called the devil, or Satan, who leads the whole world astray. He was hurled to the earth, and his angels with him.

Then I heard a loud voice in heaven say:

"Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God, and the authority of His Messiah. For the accuser of our brothers and sisters, who accuses them before our God day and night, has been hurled down.

Insight: Michael is the *chief angel* who is a champion of justice and a spiritual warrior in the battle between good and evil. In Hebrew, the name *Michael* literally translates to *one who is like God*, reflecting his role as a powerful defender of God's people. (See Daniel 10:13, 21; 12:1; Jude 1:9).

Explore and Discuss

- 1. Why is it important to know there was a war in heaven? What's the outcome of the war?
- 2. What does this passage teach you about God?
- 3. What does this passage teach you about Satan?
- 4. What strikes you as you look at these lists side-by-side?

- 5. How can these differences between God and Satan give you encouragement and hope?
- 6. How does the voice in heaven announce both victory and warning?
- 7. Christians can commit two errors, either being oblivious to the spiritual battle or being fixated on or fearful of demonic powers. How does this passage give us a balance of both?
- 8. How can we find comfort in the fact of the establishment of God's rule in heaven even as we face trials on earth?
- 9. This passage names Satan as an accuser.
 - a. What accusations do you sense he's been whispering to you?
 - b. What truths counteract these lies?
 - c. How have you either agreed with or rejected those accusations?
- 10. How would it change the way you approach life if you were more aware of Satan's attacks?

Make it Count

- What is God saying to you about this week's study and conversation?
- How do you feel you need to respond?

Closing Time of Prayer

Allow a few minutes for reflection on this question: What in your life is being attacked? Spend time praying for each other over these areas. May we fight against the enemy by praying and entering into the victory we have in Jesus.
