Conversation Starter

Describe a time you felt the presence of God.

Prayer

Spend a few minutes in prayer, inviting God into this time. Ask God to show you what He wants you to learn in this study.

Bible Study and Group Discussion

Read Revelation 2:1-7

- 1. Jesus begins His letter to the church at Ephesus by commending them for what they had done. What were they faithful to do?
- 2. Being a Christian requires hard work and perseverance. Describe a time you worked hard to do something God had called you to. How did you make it through and what helped you to continue?
- 3. Jesus next calls the Ephesians out for having left their first love. How has your love for Jesus changed over the years?
- 4. The Ephesian church did many good things out of obligation and duty rather than love. What can you do to change your focus from your task to Jesus?
- 5. It can be easy to forget all God has done in your life and end up in a place of grumbling about what He is not doing in your life now. Is there a place in your life where you are unhappy with God? Describe that and pray for God to remind you of His faithfulness and goodness.
- 6. Jesus tells the Ephesians to repent and return to their first love. Repentance requires turning away from what has caused you to stumble. What in your life do you need to repent from and return your love to Jesus? Spend time with God praying about this.

7. In verse 5, Jesus says to *Do the works you did at first*, meaning when they first believed in Him. What practices did you eagerly do when you first believed that you have since fallen away from?

Read Ephesians 4:17-24

- 8. Paul directs the Ephesians to change their behaviors and ways of thinking. What are some things you are holding onto that you need to change in your life?
- 9. In these verses, Paul tells the Ephesians to take on a new nature and be transformed, putting Jesus at the center of their lives. What are some ways that you can put Jesus at the center of your daily life? What steps can you take in the church to grow in this?
