How has your image of God changed over the years?

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read Mark 3:20-22 (This is the first part of Reading #63 in The Life of Jesus).

- 1. Jesus had just healed a man who was demon-possessed. His teaching and miracles were astounding. How were each of these groups responding: the crowds, His own family, the Scribes and Pharisees?
- 2. Who is Jesus to you?
- 3. If Jesus brings life and healing and restoration, why do so many people reject Him? Think of people in your circles who are opposed to Christ. What is the *real cause* (or source) of their rejection?
- 4. What did Perry mean in his presentation of Jesus being either a *Lunatic, Liar, or Lord*? What is your reaction to this line of thinking?
- 5. How would you respond to someone who says Jesus is a great moral teacher, but not actually God?
- 6. How does God want His followers to respond to people who have objections? *See also* Proverbs 15:1-2; <u>Isaiah 55:10-11</u>; <u>Acts 22:15</u>; <u>Philippians 1:27-30</u>; <u>2 Timothy 2:24-25</u>; <u>1 Peter 2:12</u>; <u>3:15-17</u>.
- 7. How equipped do you feel in sharing the message of Jesus with others?

Read Matthew 12:46-50 (Reading #65 in The Life of Jesus).

- 8. Summarize the main point of Jesus' response to the person in the crowd.
- 9. If someone receives Jesus as *Savior*, why also must that person surrender to Jesus as *Lord? See also* Romans 10:9-13; 2 Corinthians 5:14-15.
- 10. How could this week's message be relevant in a conversation between you and a friend or co-worker? Be specific.
- 11. What is one of the most important things you learned from this week's message? What is God saying to you?

Write out a prayer to God in response to this week's message. This will help you develop the practice of ongoing conversation with God.
