Conversation Starter

What are you really looking forward to in the coming months? How are you preparing?

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read <u>Luke 12:35-40</u> (The beginning of Reading #124 in *The Life of Jesus*).

- 1. <u>Vs. 35-38</u> describe a servant waiting for his master to return from a wedding banquet. What words and phrases describe how a good servant waits?
- 2. What does it mean to *have your lamps lit*? Why would this imagery have been particularly significant for those first century listeners?
- 3. How often does the idea of Jesus' return cross your mind?
- 4. Sometimes the servant must wait until the middle of the night, or even near dawn (vs. 38). Do you ever feel like giving up hope? What can you do to stay encouraged and awake?
- 5. How is Jesus' return likened to a thief breaking into a house?

Read <u>Luke 12:41-48</u> (continuing Reading #124 in *The Life of Jesus*).

- 6. Jesus makes it clear that each of us are responsible to be *faithful and* sensible managers while we wait for His return (vs. 41-42). How could you be more faithful and honoring to God in these areas of your life:
 - a. Work
 - b. Time
 - c. Money

- 7. <u>Vs. 45-48</u> describe a servant who diminishes the importance of daily decisions and holy living.
 - a. Is there anything God has been telling you to do that you keep putting off?
 - b. Have you used your freedom in Christ (or the idea He might not be coming back today) as an excuse to be lazy or unloving? How have you been letting yourself off the hook?

8. How does Jesus want you to be living while you wait for His return? What specific actions and attitudes from this passage are most relevant for you right now?
