Conversation Starter

Share a favorite childhood memory.

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read <u>Romans 12:1-2</u>, <u>10</u>.

- 1. How does our culture define marriage? How does this differ from God's definition of marriage? See also <u>Genesis 2:21-25</u>; <u>Ephesians 5:21-33</u>.
- 2. How can serving others be an act of worship? See <u>Deuteronomy 6:13</u>.
- 3. What are good reasons to get married? What are *not so* good reasons to get married?

Read Ecclesiastes 4:9-12.

- 4. What can you do to help your spouse (and close friends) grow closer to God?
- 5. How have you changed as a result of being married or having close friendships? Be specific. See also <u>Proverbs 13:20</u>; <u>27:5-6</u>, <u>17</u>.

Read Numbers 30:1-2; Ecclesiastes 5:4-5.

6. Why do couples make vows during their wedding ceremony? What does this level of commitment say about marriage?

Read 1 Thessalonians 1:2-6.

- 7. How does the good news of the Gospel enable us to love others?
- 8. Name at least three things you appreciate about your spouse (or a close friend) that are different from you. How can acknowledging these differences help develop intimacy?

Read 1 Corinthians 13:1-13.

9. How has this standard for love been evident (or missing) in the way you relate to your spouse or others close to you? Be specific.

Read 1 Corinthians 10:31; Colossians 3:16-17.

10. What does it mean to do all things for the glory of God?

11. How is the glory of God reflected in marriage?
