#### **Personal Reflection/Group Discussion**

Read <u>Luke 12:1-3</u> (The beginning of Reading #121 in *The Life of Jesus*).

- 1. Finish this statement: A hypocrite is someone who \_\_\_\_\_
- 2. Describe how hypocrisy is like yeast. (*Hint*: the notes on the bottom of p. 148 are really helpful!)
- 3. What are some results of pretending to be what you're not?
- 4. What happens when someone's hidden life is exposed? Describe the fallout...

Read <u>Luke 12:4-7</u> (continuing Reading #121 in *The Life of Jesus*).

- 5. In what situations do you feel the pressure to project a certain image?
- 6. Why is our desire for approval and fear of disapproval so strong?
- 7. What does it mean to *fear God*? See also: Psalm 118:5-9; Isaiah 51:12; Romans 8:31; Hebrews 13:6.
- 8. We are supposed to fear God, but not be afraid. What's the difference?
- 9. How does God's love and forgiveness free us from feeling the need to please others?

Read <u>Luke 12:8-12</u> (continuing Reading #121 in *The Life of Jesus*).

- 10. Sometimes acknowledging God means sharing what you believe with others. But sometimes, it simply means being aware of His presence (acknowledging He is right there with you). How could you have a more on-going awareness of the presence of God in the midst of everyday situations?
- 11. What benefits could this have in your relationships?
- 12. How can you grow in your ability to receive words from the Holy Spirit?
