Discussion Guide

Conversation Starter

Name and briefly describe someone you know personally who lived a truly successful life. What made that person so successful?

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read John 12:20-26 (The beginning of Reading #159 in *The Life of Jesus*).

- 1. Why were the Greeks at the festival? Does that part of the story surprise you? Why or why not?
- 2. Jesus told His mother in <u>John 2:4</u> that His time had *not yet come*. Similar statements can be found in <u>John 7:6</u>, <u>8</u>, <u>30</u>; <u>8:20</u>. Now, in <u>John 12:23</u>, He says the time *has come*. What is the time that has come and how does that connect to Jesus' comments about a grain of wheat falling into the ground and dying (vs. 24)?
- 3. In vs. 25, what does it mean to *love your life*? What does it mean to *hate your life*? What is Jesus trying to get us to understand? If you were to live this out, what would that look like?
- 4. How would you summarize the meaning of <u>John 12:23-26</u> to someone who is not a follower of Christ?
- 5. Have you ever had to suffer in order to make something better for someone else? What sacrifices can you make to enrich the lives of others around you?

Read John 12:44-50 (the end of Reading #159 in The Life of Jesus).

6. Jesus wants us to *walk in the light*. In what area of your life do you have a difficult time experiencing God or seeing Him at work?

- 7. Why did Jesus repeatedly emphasize that He did not speak on His own initiative, but only spoke what the Father commanded? What point was He making here?
- 8. What can we learn about *sensing God's voice* from the following passages?
 - a. Jeremiah 33:3
 - b. Proverbs 2:1-5
 - c. Mark 4:24-25
 - d. John 6:63
 - e. James 1:22-25
