- 2. Which of these characteristics is most inspiring to you? Why?
- 3. How did these relationships impact Paul's life and ministry?
- 4. Why do you think it was important for Tychicus and Onesimus to tell to the Colossian Church *everything that was happening* with Paul and his companions in Rome?
- 5. How important have Christian friendships been in your life? Describe.
- 6. When you think about our community at Brookwood, whose life and ministry have you benefitted from? Have you thanked those people recently?
- 7. In what ways can you be more active in your support and care for others within our church?

- 8. What is it about being involved in a ministry or mission opportunity that seems to cause strong bonds of friendship between people who might not have been close before?
- 9. What are ways you could become more involved in ministry-grounded friendships like this? What might be the result in your own walk with God if you did?
- 10. Paul ends by asking the Colossians to remember my chains. What should be our attitude and response to Christians around the world being persecuted for the faith? See also Hebrews 13:3.
- 11. What will you remember most from this week's teaching and discussion?
