Have your family or friends ever been shocked when you changed your mind about something or took an unexpected new direction in life? Describe the situation.

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read John 4:5-9.

1. What in this story would have seemed strange, unconventional or just plain wrong to people living in Jesus' time and culture?

Read John 4:10-15.

- 2. What misunderstandings arise between Jesus and the woman?
- 3. How does Jesus' living water satisfy our needs?
- 4. Describe a time when you had a thirst for God.

Read John 4:16-26.

- 5. How does the topic of water relate to the woman's marital status?
- 6. What excuses or reasons do people offer today for not seeking God?
- 7. What are ways people try to fill the emptiness in their lives in our day?
- 8. What does it mean to worship in spirit and truth (vs. 23)?

- 9. What is one practical step God is leading you to take based on John 4:34-38?
- 10. What was the woman's impact on her community (vs. <u>39-44</u>)? How could you have a similar impact on the people around you?
- 11. What would Jesus say to you if He walked up and saw you today?
