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Discussion Guide

Conversation Starter

Describe a time you deserved punishment, but instead were offered mercy (a real-life situation when you did something wrong but were let off the hook).

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read *The Life of Jesus,* **Reading #202** (this is a harmony of Matthew 27:38, 44; Mark 15:27-28; Luke 23:39-43).

- 1. Describe the attitude of the first criminal. What was in his heart? What causes someone to be like this?
- 2. Now consider the second criminal. How would you describe him?
- 3. What did the second criminal believe about himself and about Jesus?
- 4. What did the first criminal want to be saved from?
- 5. What did the second criminal want to be saved from?
- 6. Sometimes we want God to fix our circumstances more than we want to know God. Can you think of a time when this has been true of you?
- 7. What do we learn about Jesus by the way He responded to each of the criminals?

- 8. Define these terms: mercy, grace, and repentance. What's the particular significance of each of these for a follower of Christ?
- 9. What would we be missing if this account of the two criminals had not been included in the Bible?
- 10. What's the most significant part of this week's teaching for you? How does God want you to respond?

Soul Training

Read Romans 5:6-11. Talk with God about a time you were far away from Him. Thank God for remembering you and caring about you. Spend time thanking God that out of His great love, He sent Jesus to die for you. Use this time to practice uniting your heart with God's overwhelming love.
