Discussion Guide

Conversation Starter

Name one thing you've always wanted but never bought because it costs too much.

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read Matthew 19:16-30; Mark 10:17-31; Luke 18:18-30 (Reading #149 in *The Life of Jesus*).

- 1. What specific question did the man ask Jesus? Why do you think he asked that question? What were his motives?
- 2. Why do you think it's so common for people to feel like they have to do good things to get to heaven or to be with God?
- 3. Why do you think Jesus responded the way He did (Mt 19:17)?
- 4. The man may have lived a fairly moral life, but, in your own words, what was he still lacking?
- 5. If salvation is not achieved by giving away possessions, why do you think Jesus gave the young man the instructions in Matthew 19:21?
- 6. How did the man respond (Mt 19:22)? What does this reveal about his heart?
- 7. From what you've seen so far in this story, how had the man already violated the first commandment (see Ex 20:3)?

- 8. Why is it hard for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God? Why were the disciples astonished when Jesus said this (Mk 10:25)?
- 9. Is Jesus saying that it's wrong to have money? Why or why not? What other verses in the Bible support your answer?
- 10. <u>Mark 10:27</u> sounds like a really nice Bible verse, but what is Jesus really saying? What is the point of this verse?
- 11. When have you asked God, either silently or out loud, the question Peter asks in Matthew 19:27 (or one similar to it)?
- 12. Based on this passage, what is one step you could take to be in greater partnership with God?

Soul Training

Make a list of things you're thankful for, as you go through your week. Sometime later in the week, find quiet space and read through your list with God. Thank Him for His goodness. Ask Him to fill your heart with greater thankfulness and joy for who He is and all He has given you.
