- 4. What are specific examples of what it looks like for a church to live out vs. 2? What would people be doing?
- 5. What do the following passages teach about Jesus?
 - a) Philippians 2:5-7
 - b) <u>John 1:17-18</u>
 - c) Colossians 1:15-17; 2:9-10
 - d) <u>2 Peter 1:1</u>
 - e) 1 John 5:20

Read Matthew 16:13-19.
